- would render her unsuitable to be elected to the positions of Political Leader and Leader of the Opposition. The Claimant began by stating that we were now witnessing a part of Miss. Mottley's DNA. He accused her of giving out money during the 2008 General Elections to make Mr. Clyde Mascoll a then BLP Candidate and previously a Democratic Labour Party (DLP) Political Leader and Leader of the Opposition, lose his seat. He then accused Miss. Mottley of giving money to persons to vote against about six (6) or seven (7) BLP candidates, including himself and Mr. Dale Marshall, in the General Elections which were held four (4) days previously.
 - 16. The Claimant stated further that Miss. Mottley was not in a position to serve as our leader because of her antecedents. He said, too, that we could not reward Miss. Mottley for her bad behaviour. He also said that one of the best things to have happened in the BLP was the removal of Miss Mottley in October, 2010 as its Political Leader and as Leader of the Opposition.
- 17. The Claimant then proceeded to accuse Miss. Mottley, who is also a Queens Counsel, a former Deputy Prime Minister, Attorney General and Cabinet Minister, of embezzling funds from the BLP during the period in which she had served as Leader of the Opposition and of placing these funds in her Foundation's account. He specifically mentioned that during that time ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) which was donated to the BLP was not placed in the Party's account. He further accused her of assisting his opponent, Mrs. Irene Sandiford-Garner, against him in the just concluded General Elections. He said that one of Miss. Mottley's vehicles was seen in Saint Andrew assisting his opponent. He also accused Miss. Mottley of assisting the DLP against other BLP candidates and of generally acting against the interest of the BLP.
 - 18. Mr. Marshall, in his capacity as the meeting's chairman, never once sought to interrupt the Claimant, in whom he has absolutely complete, unquestioned and deific loyalty, in order to bring him to any order or to caution him against making such abusive and vulgar statements.
