**AFFIDAVIT**

I, **DELVINA WATSON** of No. 2 Long Bay in the parish of Saint Philip and island of Barbados MAKE OATH AND SAY as follows:-

- 1) I am the above-named Defendant/Judgment/Debtor in this action.
- 2) The Plaintiff, Cottle Catford & Co., was at all material times a legal firm comprising as partners the attorneys-at-law Allan St.Clair Watson, Joyce Griffith and Philip Vernon Nicholls whose shares in the assets of the said partnership were at all material times respectively 35%, 33% and 32%.
- 3) The said partnership was dissolved on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December 2002. I attach hereto a copy of the Notice of Dissolution published in the Daily Nation Newspaper on Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2002 as **Exhibit "DW 1"**.
- 4) On the 30<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2004 the Plaintiff issued the Writ of summons herein against me claiming:
  - 1) The sum of \$168,847.08 owed by me to the Plaintiff between the 12<sup>th</sup> January, 2000 and the 30<sup>th</sup> July, 2001.
  - 2) Interest on the said sum of \$168,847.08 at such rate and for such period as the court thinks just pursuant to Section 35A of the Supreme Court Act.
  - 3) Costs to be agreed or taxed with vat on such costs as taxed and agreed
- 5) On the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2004, by my attorney-at-Law, Vernon O. Smith of Smith & Smith, attorneys-at-law I filed an Acknowledgment of Service of the said writ of summons herein acknowledging service thereof and stating that I did not intend to contest
