

5. Judgment was entered in Suit No. 151 and 152 of 2004 in favour of the Plaintiff in the sum of \$168,847.08 together with interest thereon at a rate of 8% per annum from the 19<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2004 until payment and costs in the sum of \$1,608.25.
6. The Defendant obtained a loan by way of Mortgage over her property in Worthing, Christ Church in this Island and instructed me to make arrangements to liquidate the debt created by the judgment.
7. On 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2007 on the instructions of the Defendant, I paid Joyce Griffith, Attorney-at-Law in respect of Suit No. 151 of 2004, the sum of \$69,422.12 and in respect of Suit No. 152 of 2004, the sum of \$39,594.05 in full satisfaction of her 33% share in Cottle Catford, inclusive of all interest and cost accrued thereon. I attach a certified copy of the duly stamped and signed receipts as evidence of payment and mark them as Exhibits 'VS1' and 'VS2' respectively.
8. On 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2007 on the instructions of the Defendant, I paid Allan St. Clair Watson, Attorney-at-Law in respect of Suit No. 151 of 2004, the sum of \$73,629.53 and in respect of Suit No. 152 of 2004, the sum of \$41,993.70 in full satisfaction of his 35% share in Cottle Catford inclusive of all interest and cost accrued thereon. I attach a certified copy of the duly stamped and signed receipts as evidence of payment and mark them as Exhibits 'VS3' and 'VS4' respectively.
9. On 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2007 on the instructions of the Defendant and under cover of a letter dated 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2007, I paid Philip Vernon Nicholls, Attorney-at-Law the sum of \$108,491.16 by a cheque #12526 dated 13<sup>th</sup> April, 2007 drawn by Smith & Smith, in full satisfaction of his 32% share in Cottle Catford, inclusive of all interest accrued thereon, together with \$1,608.25 representing taxed costs, in respect of Suits No. 151 and 152 of 2004. I attach a certified copy of the said letter together with a certified copy of the cashed cheque as evidence of payment and mark them as Exhibits 'VS5' and 'VS6' respectively.
10. By letter dated 24<sup>th</sup> April, 2007, George Bennett on behalf of Philip Vernon Nicholls acknowledged receipt of the payment of \$108,491.16 to Philip Vernon Nicholls. Philip Vernon Nicholls however refused to sign the receipts sent which
