Dear Sirs,

My Complaint About Leodean Worrell & Jalisa Watson

Please accept this letter as a formal complaint against the BBA Disciplinary Committee. This complaint is, because of your failure to address my complaint against the two Lawyers named above, in a timely fashion: or at all. It has been nearly a year since my complaint, and you have still not investigated my complaint, nor are you able to tell me when my complaint will be dealt with.

It seems appropriate that I should also inform you that, I have sent a copy of this letter to a number of organisations and government departments.

I should say at the outset that the losses to me are far too great for me to sustain without redress. Unlike the wealthier people who contacted me and informed me that Leodean Worrell had stolen their money and caused them losses, my financial circumstances do not predispose me, to sustain the loss of this life changing some of money. I need to have my money back and I am entitled to compensation for the abuse that I endured.

In my e-mail to you dated 8th May 2025, I asked you when I am likely to receive the outcome of my complaint. In the same e-mail I informed you of other people who have contacted me about Leodean Worrell taking their money. I said this:

“The second reason that I write to you is to tell you that I have been contacted by three people, one as recently as this morning telling me about their horrible experience at the hands of Leodean Worrell. One is a well-known Gentleman on the Island with significant

business interests. The second Gentleman is a Canadian Gentleman who owns a property on the Island. Both have asked me not to disclose their names at this stage, but they may consider coming forward in the future, if I need support.

The third gentleman is Stephen Reasbeck, he contacted me today and he is happy to have his name used. I will forward Mr. Reasbeck e-mail to you if you wish. He too suffered significant losses.

It is in the public interest that Leodean is dealt with as soon as possible.”

In relation to my complaint against Leodean Worrell, you informed me on the 9th May 2025 that she did not even respond to the complaint. You also informed me that you have no idea when and that you cannot give me a time estimate for investigating my complaint.

As I heard nothing since May 2025. I then wrote to you on the 24th of July and inform you that, unless I have a response by 1st August 2025, telling me the date by which my complaint will be dealt with, I would be approaching the media. You did not reply to that e-mail.

Conclusion

I am entitled to have my complaint investigated, in Jalisa Watson’s case. In Leodean Worrell’s case, as she has not responded to the complaint, the disciplinary committee has an obligation to find my complaint proven and refund me my losses. Outside of the compensation, that I am entitled to because of the abuse that I was subjected to by Mrs Worrell, she took my money, and she caused me to lose tens of thousands of pounds. I need to have that money immediately, I have waited long enough.

It is obviously a matter for the Disciplinary Committee how they deal with Lawyers who show utter contempt for its rules by not responding to complaints. However, surely it must be taken that my complaint is proven, if there is no response from the Lawyer who is the subject of the complaint.

I trust that you will treat me with the regard that I am entitled to as a member of the public, and either compensate me or tell me when you intend to deal with my complaint. I say this, most respectfully, this is not what anyone would expect from an organisation of this importance, in a Country like Barbados which prides itself on fairness and integrity.
